

Domestic Violence, Stalking, and Sexual Assault In Kansas

As Reported by Law Enforcement Agencies



2020

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Introduction

The Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI) compiled the following report on domestic violence, stalking, and sexual violence statistics for 2020. The data represents the most accurate information available, reflecting domestic violence, rape, stalking, sodomy, and sexual battery incidents as reported by law enforcement agencies through the Kansas Incident Based Reporting System (KIBRS). This system enables crime information from standard offense and arrest reports to be entered manually, submitted electronically, or with summary counts from Kansas law enforcement agencies.

This report is intended to assist agencies in strengthening the criminal justice system which holds offenders accountable for their actions and provides resources to help respond to these crimes.

This report does not claim to represent all domestic violence incidents, stalking offenses, or sexually violent incidents committed throughout the State of Kansas, as it is dependent on victims reporting crimes to law enforcement agencies and on these agencies submitting the incident report to the KBI. Only domestic violence, stalking, and sexually violent incident and arrest reports that were submitted to the KBI were counted for this report.

Since 1992, all Kansas law enforcement agencies have been required to make mandatory arrests for domestic violence incidents when there is probable cause that a crime was committed. Officers are also required to fill out a Kansas Standard Offense report for every domestic violence incident, whether or not an arrest was made. Each law enforcement agency is required to have a written policy describing its protocol for addressing domestic violence incidents.

Effective in July 2011, the state legislature passed a bill creating a universal definition for domestic violence incidents. This definition is required by statute to be used by all Kansas law enforcement agencies. The definition can be found on page seven (7) of this publication.

OFFENSES

The domestic violence section of this report includes, but is not limited to, offenses that involve: murder, assault, aggravated assault, assault on a law enforcement officer, aggravated assault on a law enforcement officer, battery, aggravated battery, battery on a law enforcement officer, aggravated battery on a law enforcement officer, rape, theft, unlawful deprivation of property, burglary, and aggravated burglary. Some of these offenses may not meet the definition of domestic violence but are included because they were additional offenses within an incident that involved a domestic violence offense.

DUAL ARRESTS

The domestic violence section of this report includes “dual arrests” which refers to cases where more than one person was arrested for the same domestic violence incident. In a number of cases, this is the result of an incident where the primary aggressor cannot be determined so both parties involved are arrested. There also may be a number of cases in which multiple arrests were made at the incident because a third party may have intervened. Because of this “dual arrest” procedure, some agencies have reported more arrests than incidents in a particular year. By factoring in dual arrests, a more accurate arrest percentage can be reported.

CLEARANCES VS ARRESTS

Several references to arrest rates are made throughout this publication. Exceptional clearances are methods to close a case, other than with an arrest. Examples of an exceptional clearance are: death of the offender, when a victim refuses to testify, when

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extradition is denied, when prosecution is denied, or when a juvenile is released to a parent. Therefore, agencies may clear a case even without an arrest.

TABLES AND GRAPHS

Several tables and graphs regarding domestic violence, stalking, and sexually violent crimes, are included in this report. Some domestic violence, stalking, and sexually violent incidents may have had more than one offense, victim, offender, type of weapon, or victim-offender relationship. Some reports were not filled out completely, making detailed information on the incident unknown or unavailable. For this reason, the totals for each section will not always match.

In order to present the most accurate representation of domestic violence, stalking, and sexual violence, the information for this report was recorded as it was reported to the KBI by law enforcement agencies as of May 1, 2021.

ROUNDING

The percentage totals on some tables may not always equal 100% due to rounding.

AGENCIES NOT REPORTING COMPLETE DATA

This report distinguishes between agencies who have sent no data and those who have sent incomplete data. If an agency submits offense reports for 2 months or less in the year, they are listed as not having submitted data. If an agency submits offense reports for 9 months or less in the year, they are listed as did not submit complete data.

RAPE DEFINITION

In 2013, the Federal Bureau of Investigation changed their definition of rape to include sodomy and sexual assault. This report continues to use the historical definition as defined on page 57. However, separate sections have been included for criminal sodomy and sexual assault.

DATA GROUPING DEFINITIONS

Some fields have been combined within charts in order to show a more statistically relevant view of detailed data. These groupings use the following definitions:

- Significant other - spouse, ex-spouse, common law spouse, boyfriend/girlfriend, ex-boyfriend/girlfriend, and same sex relationships
- Family Member - parent, child, sibling, grandparent, grandchild, in-law, step and foster parent/child/sibling, other family member, child of boyfriend/girlfriend, victim was boyfriend/girlfriend of suspect's parent
- Other known - acquaintance, friend, roommate, neighbor, babysittee, employer, employee, co-worker, and otherwise known
- Open area - parking lot/garage, street, alley, highway, rural road, vacant lot, park building/shelter, open area, lake/waterway, recreational facility, and car wash
- Hospitality - tavern/bar, restaurant, hotel/motel/inn, and casino
- Workplace - employee, employer, co-worker
- Time of Day - Day=6am to 2pm, Evening=2pm to 10pm, Night=10pm to 6am
- Type of Injury - Major- all injuries not listed as apparent minor injury or none

Domestic Violence

In 1991, the Kansas Legislature enacted mandates that required all Kansas law enforcement agencies to adopt written policies regarding their procedures for responding to domestic violence incidents within their jurisdictions. Each law enforcement policy must include a directive that officers who have probable cause that a crime was committed at a domestic violence incident “shall make an arrest.” All standard offense reports were required to be submitted to the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI) beginning in January 1992, whether or not an arrest was made. Since this legislative action, Kansas law enforcement agencies have increased arrest rates for domestic violence related crimes from 37.1 percent in 1992 to 48.2 percent in 2020.

Victim and offender characteristics for domestic violence have not changed drastically. Still, the average victim is a female between the ages of 20 and 34. The average offender is a male between the ages of 20 and 34 and is most often the spouse, boyfriend/girlfriend, or former boyfriend/girlfriend of the victim. Saturdays and Sundays are the two days when domestic violence incidents are most likely to occur. Incidents are most likely to occur between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and noon or between midnight and 2:00 a.m.

Domestic violence can be defined as any verbal and/or physical abuse ranging from simple assault to murder. In 2020, 60.8 percent of all domestic violence offenses involved the criminal offense of battery. Battery is defined as *“intentionally or recklessly causing bodily harm to another person or intentionally causing physical contact with another person when done in a rude, insulting or angry manner.”* In 2001, the Kansas Legislature enacted the *“domestic battery”* statute which is *“(1) intentionally or recklessly causing bodily harm by a family or household member against a family or household member; or (2) intentionally causing physical contact with a family or household member by a family or household member when done in a rude, insulting or angry manner.”*

Most domestic violence offenders use some type of bodily force against their victims and most use their hands, fists, or feet as personal weapons. An incident of domestic violence most often occurs at home. Almost half (47.3 percent) of all victims receive visible injuries.

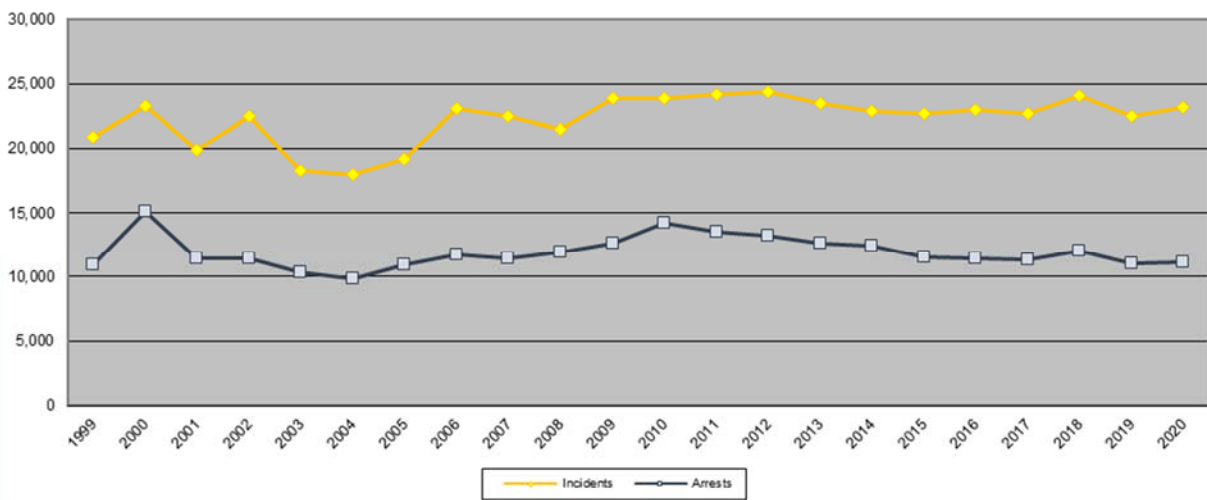
"Domestic violence" means an act or threatened act of violence against a person with whom the offender is involved or has been involved in a dating relationship, or an act or threatened act of violence against a family or household member by a family or household member. Domestic violence also includes any other crime committed against a person or against property, or any municipal ordinance violation against a person or against property, when directed against a person with whom the offender is involved or has been involved in a dating relationship or when directed against a family or household member by a family or household member. For the purposes of this definition:

(1) "Dating relationship" means a social relationship of a romantic nature. In addition to any other factors the court deems relevant, the trier of fact may consider the following when making a determination of whether a relationship exists or existed: nature of the relationship, length of time the relationship existed, frequency of interaction between the parties, and time since termination of the relationship, if applicable.

(2) "Family or household member" means persons 18 years of age or older who are spouses, former spouses, parents or stepparents and children or stepchildren, and persons who are presently residing together or have resided together in the past, and persons who have a child in common, regardless of whether they have been married or have lived together at any time. Family or household member also includes a man and woman if the woman is pregnant and the man is alleged to be the father, regardless of whether they have been married or have lived together at any time.

Kansas Domestic Violence Homicide Trend

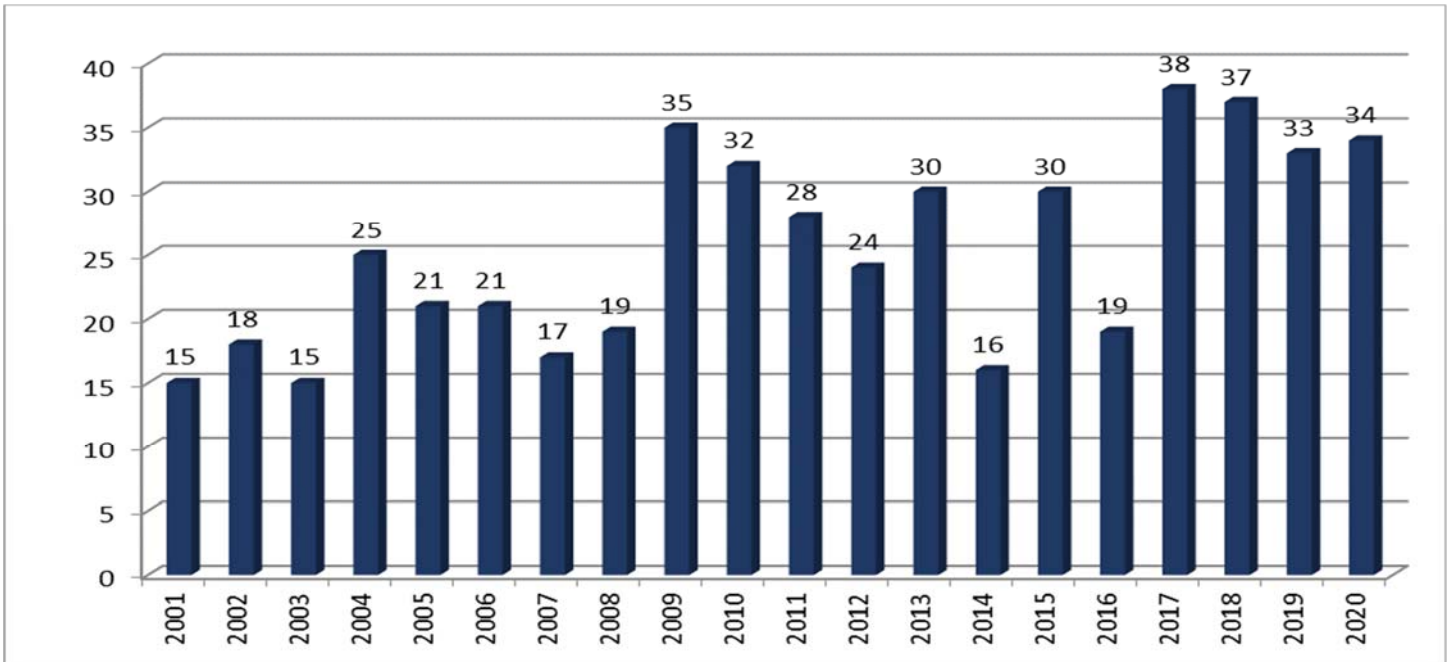

The victims included are spouses, former spouses, persons in intimate relationships whether on-going or in the past, and persons 18 years of age or older who are blood or step-related to one another.

Only adults who have been killed in a domestic violence situation are reported in this statistical information. Cases involving children are reviewed by the State Child Death Review Board (SCDRB) and statistical information can be found in the SCDRB report at www.ksag.org.

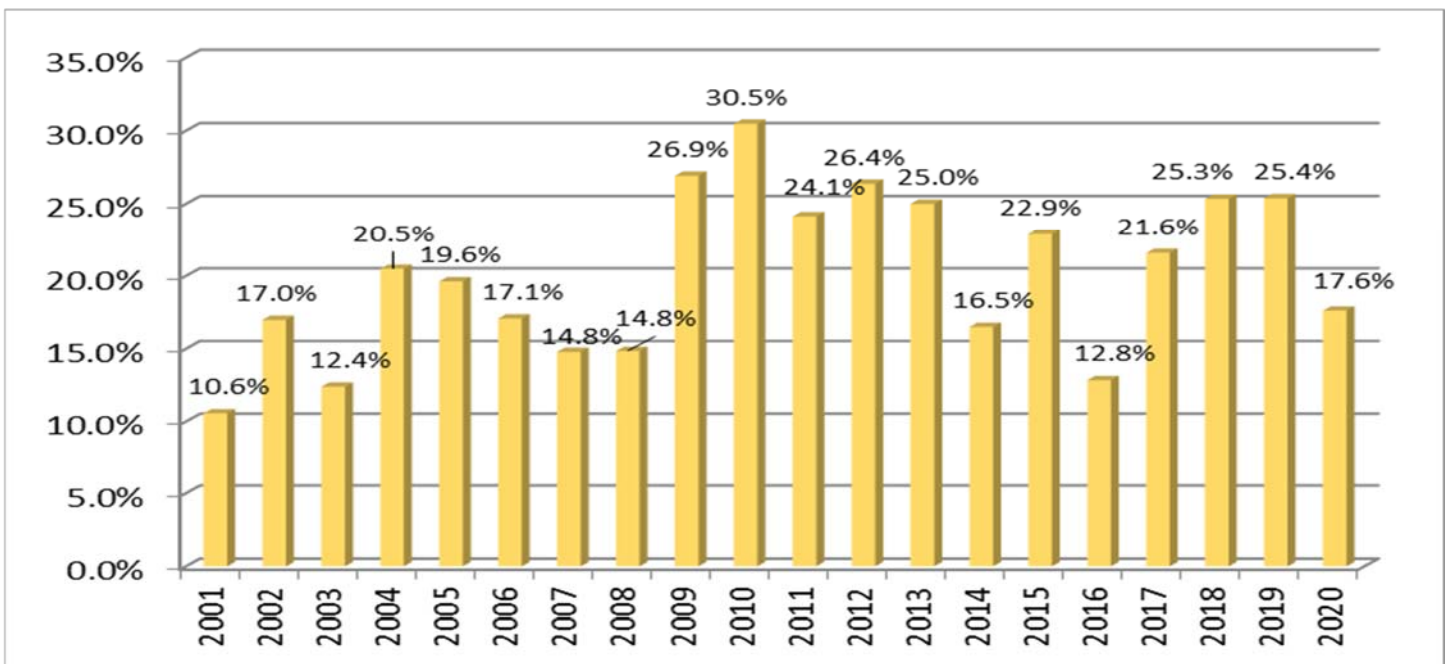

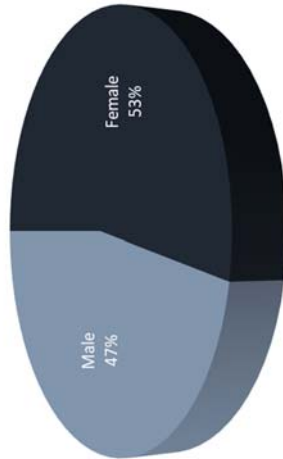

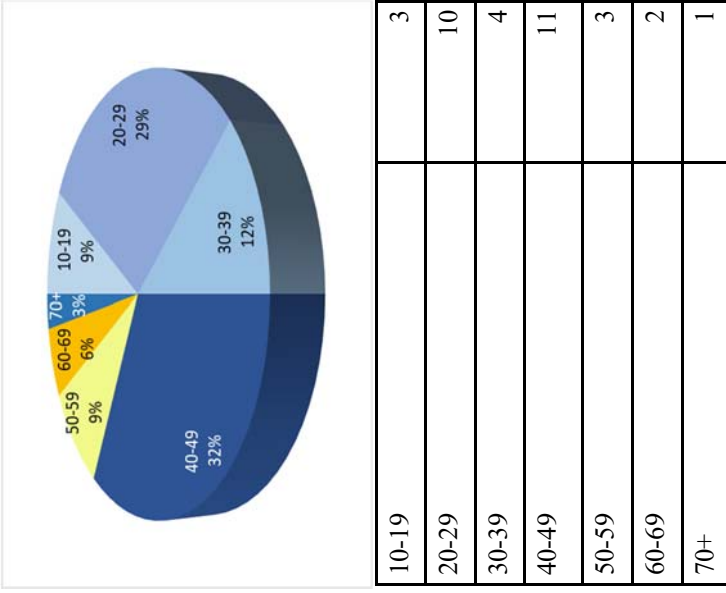

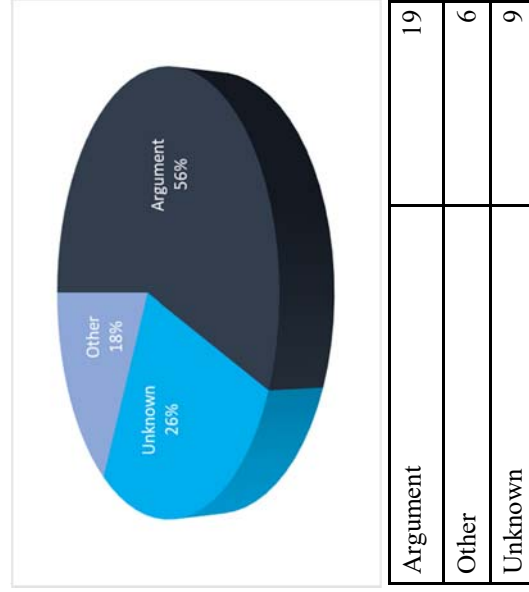



These crime clocks should be viewed with care. Being the most aggregate representation of crime data, they are designed to convey the annual crime experience by showing the relative frequency of occurrence of crime incidents. This mode of display should not be taken to imply a regularity in the commission of these incidents; rather, it represents the annual ratio of crime to fixed time intervals.

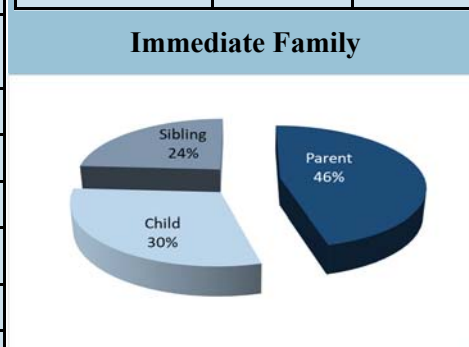

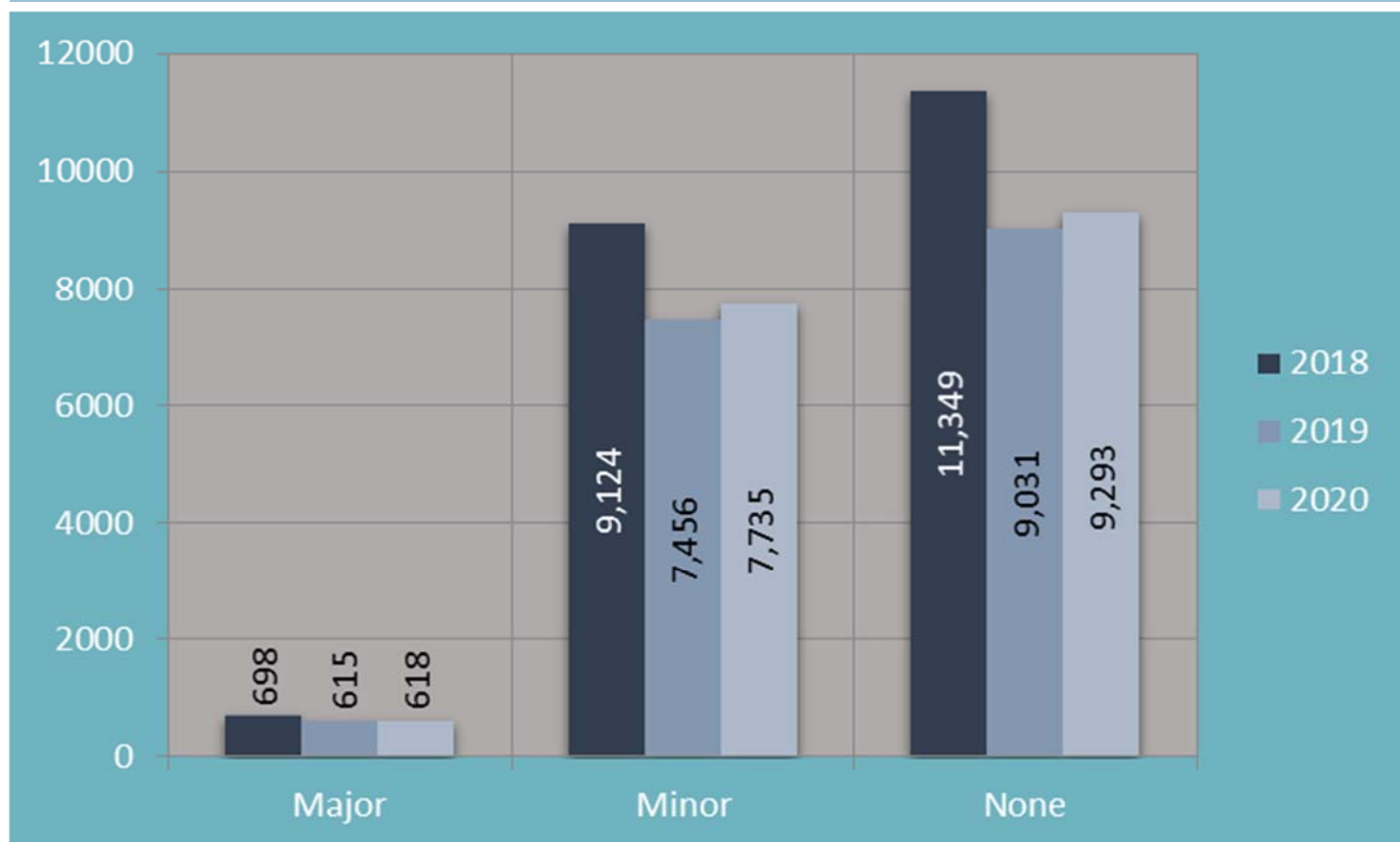

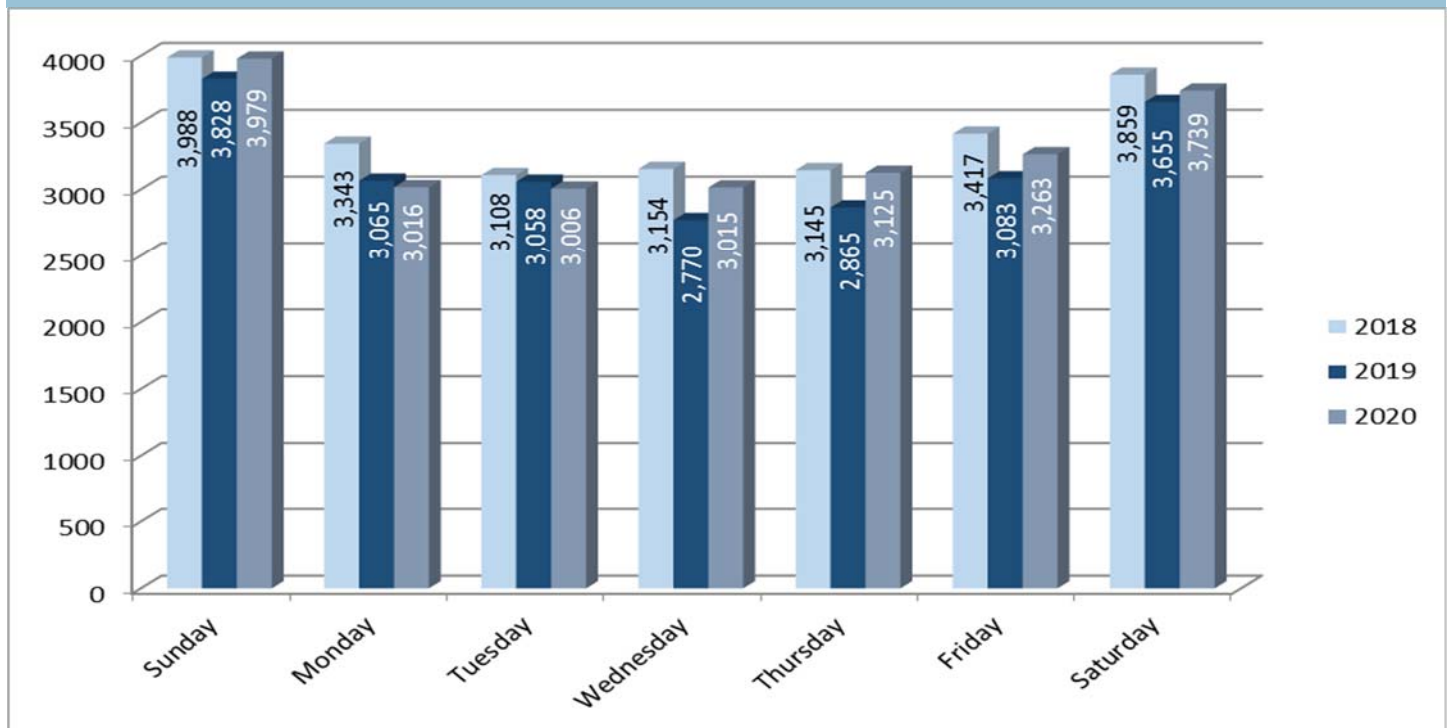

Domestic Violence: Day of Occurrence 3yr Trend

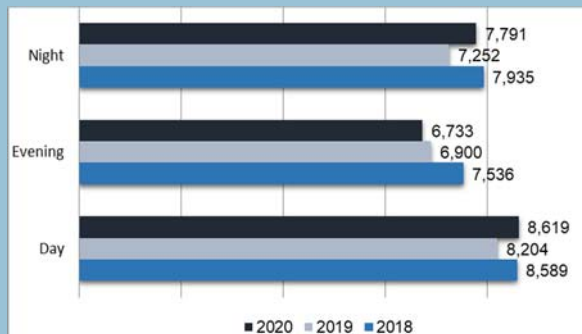

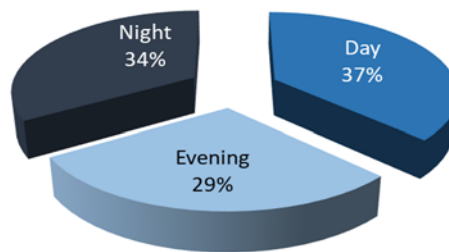

Shift 3yr Trend



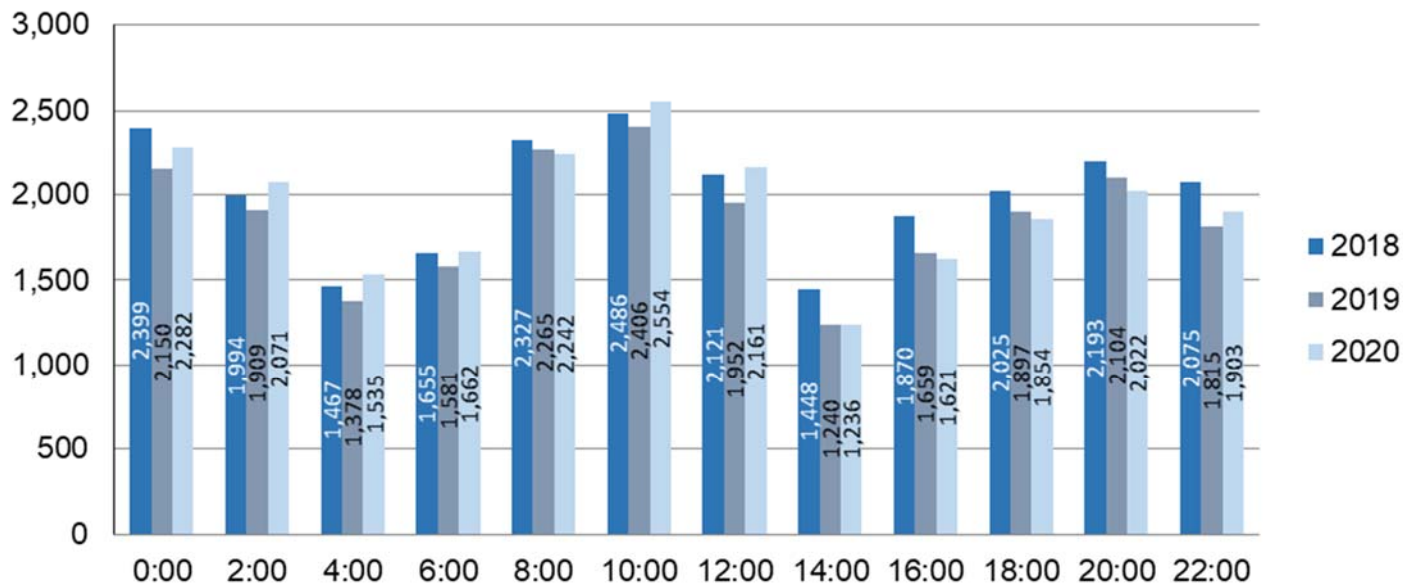
2020 Percentage ²

Protection From Abuse Act

K.S.A. 60-3101 through 60-3112

The Kansas Legislature created the Protection from Abuse Act (PFA) in 1979. According to the statute, *“this act shall be liberally construed to promote the protection of victims of domestic violence from bodily injury or threats of bodily injury and to facilitate access to judicial protection for the victims, whether represented by counsel or proceeding pro se.”*

A protection order is a court order for the purpose of preventing further violent or threatening behavior. The PFA instructs a specific individual to refrain from having contact with another individual. Any district court shall have jurisdiction over the proceedings in obtaining an order. A person who is seeking relief under this act may obtain a petition from the clerk of the district court or from a domestic violence program.

A person seeking relief under this act must have lived with the abuser either presently or in the past or have a child in common. A parent or an adult residing with a minor child may seek a petition on behalf of the minor child. As of July 1, 2002, persons in dating relationships also can apply for a protection order. Once an order is filed with the court, a temporary order is issued and a hearing is set within 20 days. The final order can be issued for up to one year. No more than two orders can be filed within one year.

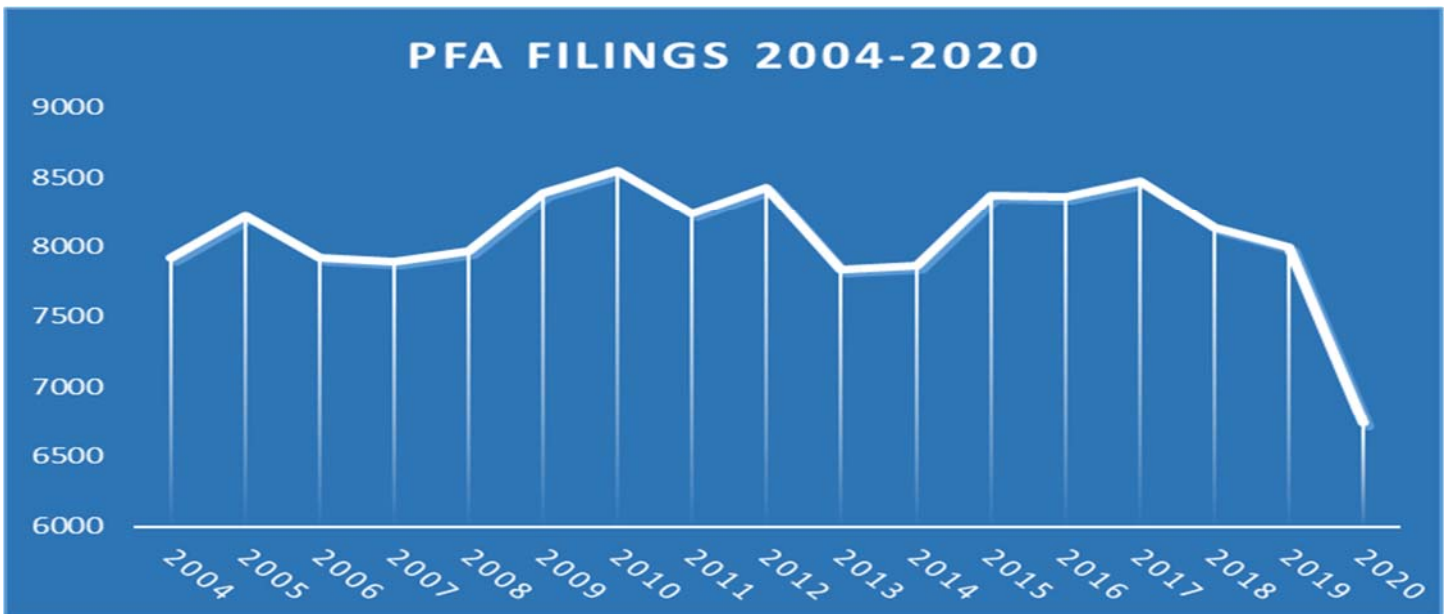
The 2006 Kansas Legislature passed two bills designed to assist those in need of protective orders. The first bill fills the gap of previous statutes and considers a violation of the PFA act to include making contact with the victim while offender is incarcerated. The second, took effect January 1, 2007 and allows persons attempting to escape a domestic violence situation to obtain a confidential address from the Secretary of State’s office to use as a substitute legal mailing address.

The following information reflects the number of PFA orders filed with Kansas district courts and reported to the Kansas Office of Judicial Administration.

Protection From Stalking Act

K.S.A. 60-31a01 through 60-31a09

The Kansas Legislature created the Protection from Stalking Act (PFS) during the 2002 session. The statute is to be “*liberally construed to protect victims of stalking and to facilitate access to judicial protection for stalking victims, whether represented by counsel or proceedings pro se.*” The PFS allows the court to refrain a defendant from harassing, telephoning, contacting, or otherwise communicating with the victim. A Protection from Stalking Order is a court order for the purpose of preventing stalking behavior against the victim. A person seeking relief under this act may obtain an order from the clerk of the district court in the county where the stalking occurred. Once an order is filed with the court, a temporary order is issued and a hearing is set within 20 days. A final order may be issued for a period of one year. However, “*upon motion by the plaintiff, such a period may be extended for an additional year.*”

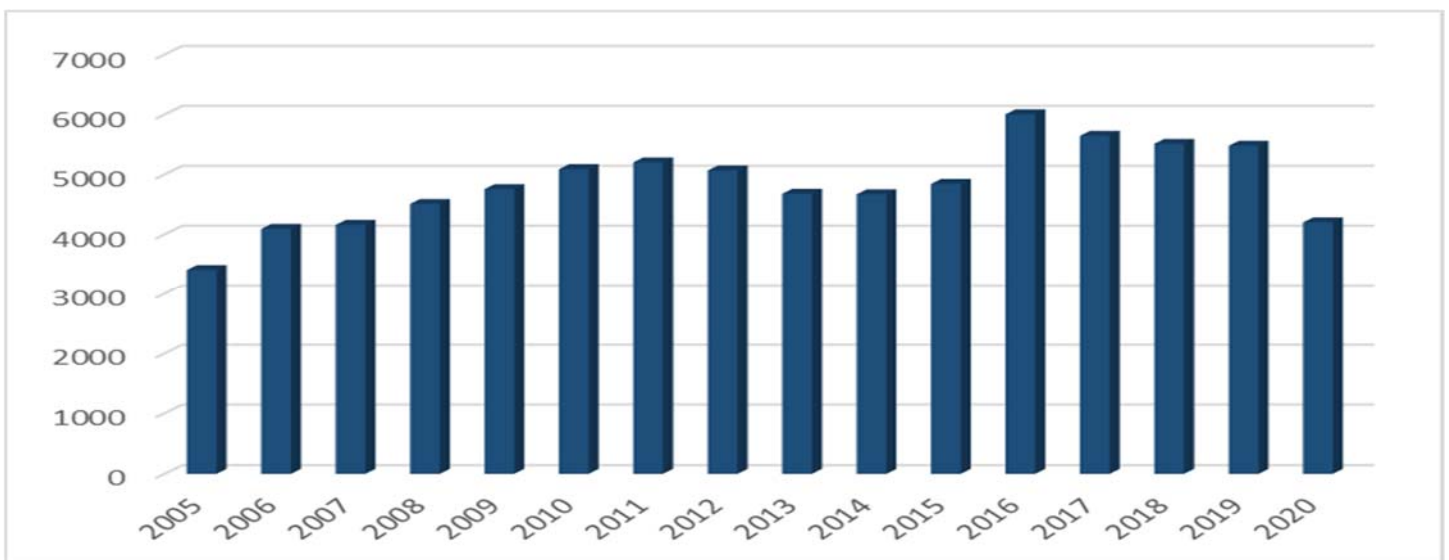

Stalking

Stalking is an exercise of control and power over another individual or group. The variation in stalking behavior ranges from hang-up phone calls to more direct threats toward a victim. The likelihood of injury increases when the stalking behavior escalates over time.

In 2008, the Kansas Legislature amended the definition of Stalking. This statutory change was reflected in the large increase of offenses reported since 2009.

Stalking is defined as:

(1) *“Intentionally or recklessly engaging in a course of conduct targeted at a specific person which would cause a reasonable person in the circumstances of the targeted person to fear for such person’s safety, or the safety of a member of such person’s immediate family and the targeted person is actually placed in such fear; or*

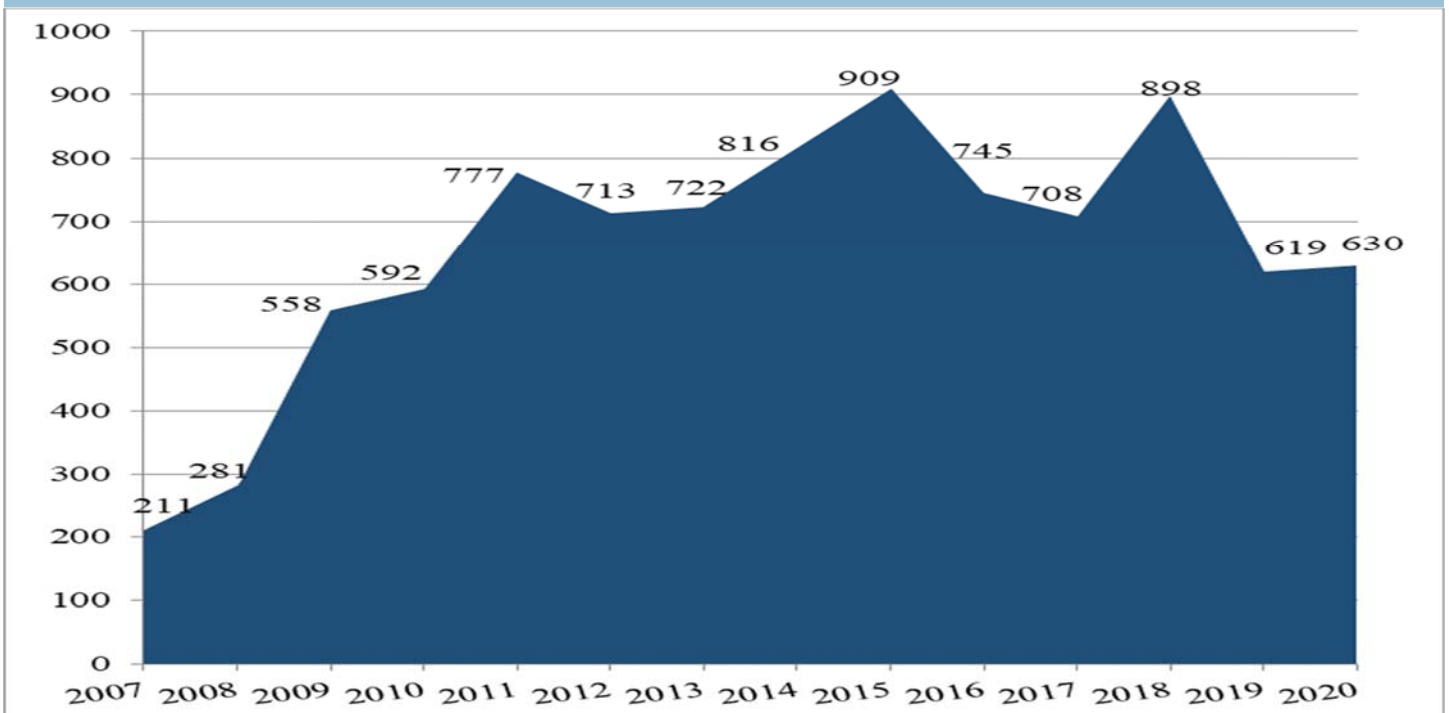
(2) intentionally engaging in a course of conduct targeted at a specific person which the individual knows will place the targeted person in fear for such person’s safety or the safety of a member of such person’s immediate family; or

(3) after being served with, or otherwise provided notice of, any protective order included in K.S.A. 21-3843, prior to its repeal or K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 21-5924, and amendments thereto, that prohibits contact with a targeted person, recklessly engaging in at least one act listed in subsection (f)(1) that violates the provisions of the order and would cause a reasonable person to fear for such person's safety, or the safety of a member of such person's immediate family and the targeted person is actually placed in such fear.



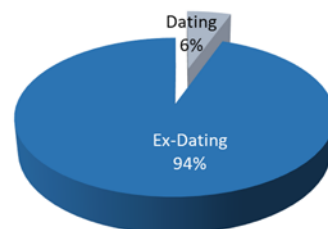

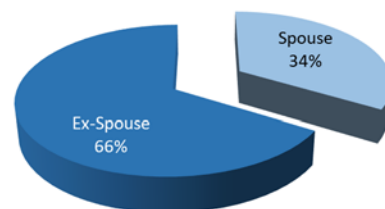

2020 Current vs. Former Dating



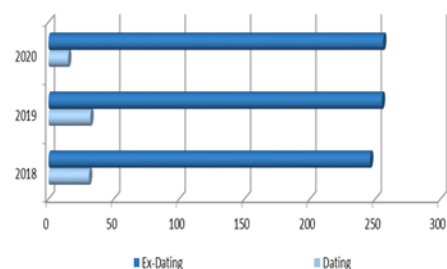
2020 Current vs. Former Spouse

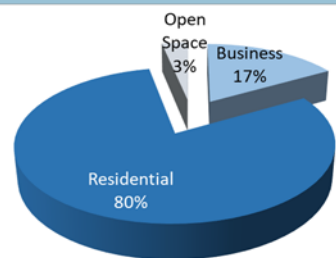

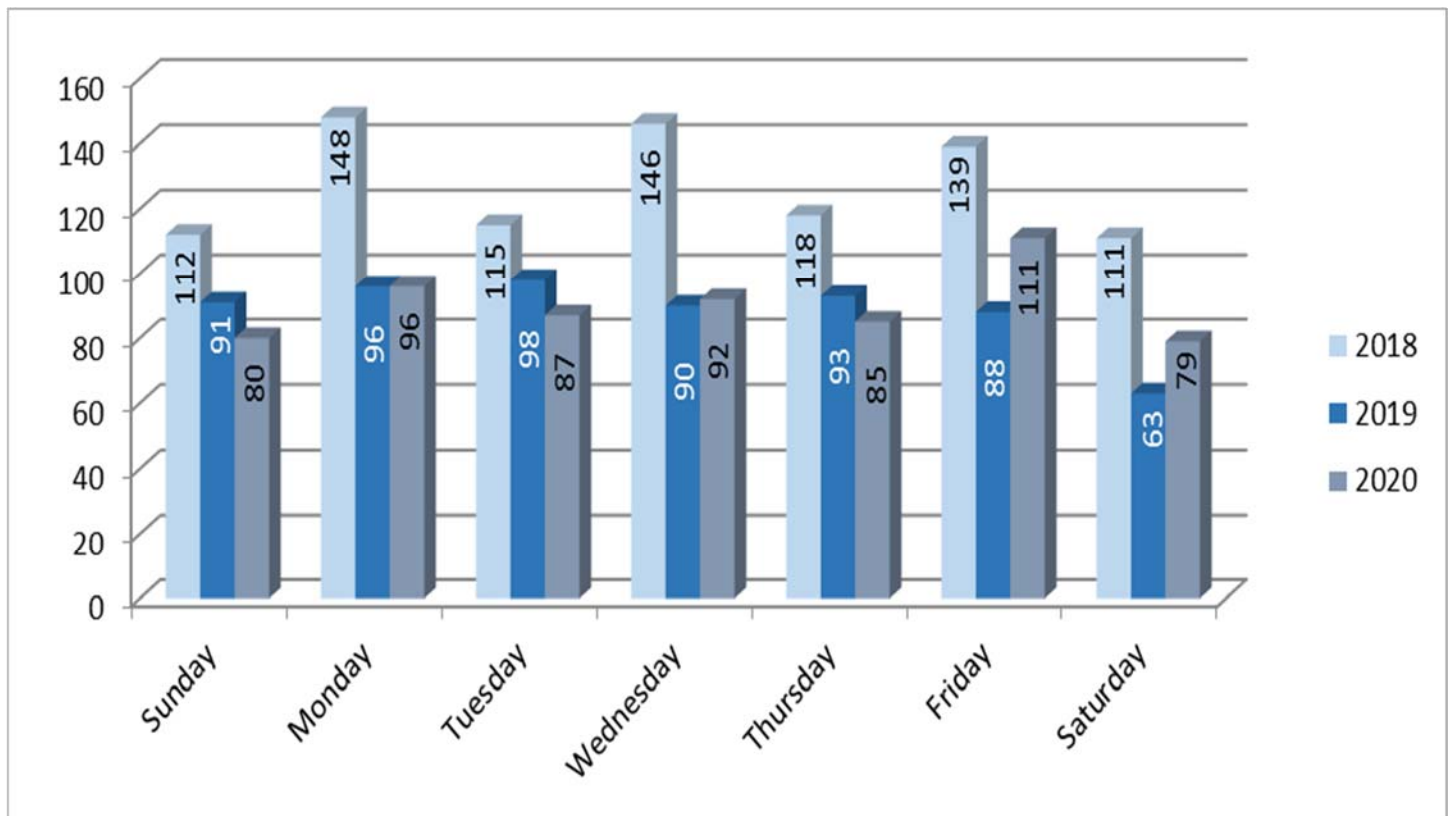

Stalking: Day of Occurrence 3yr Trend



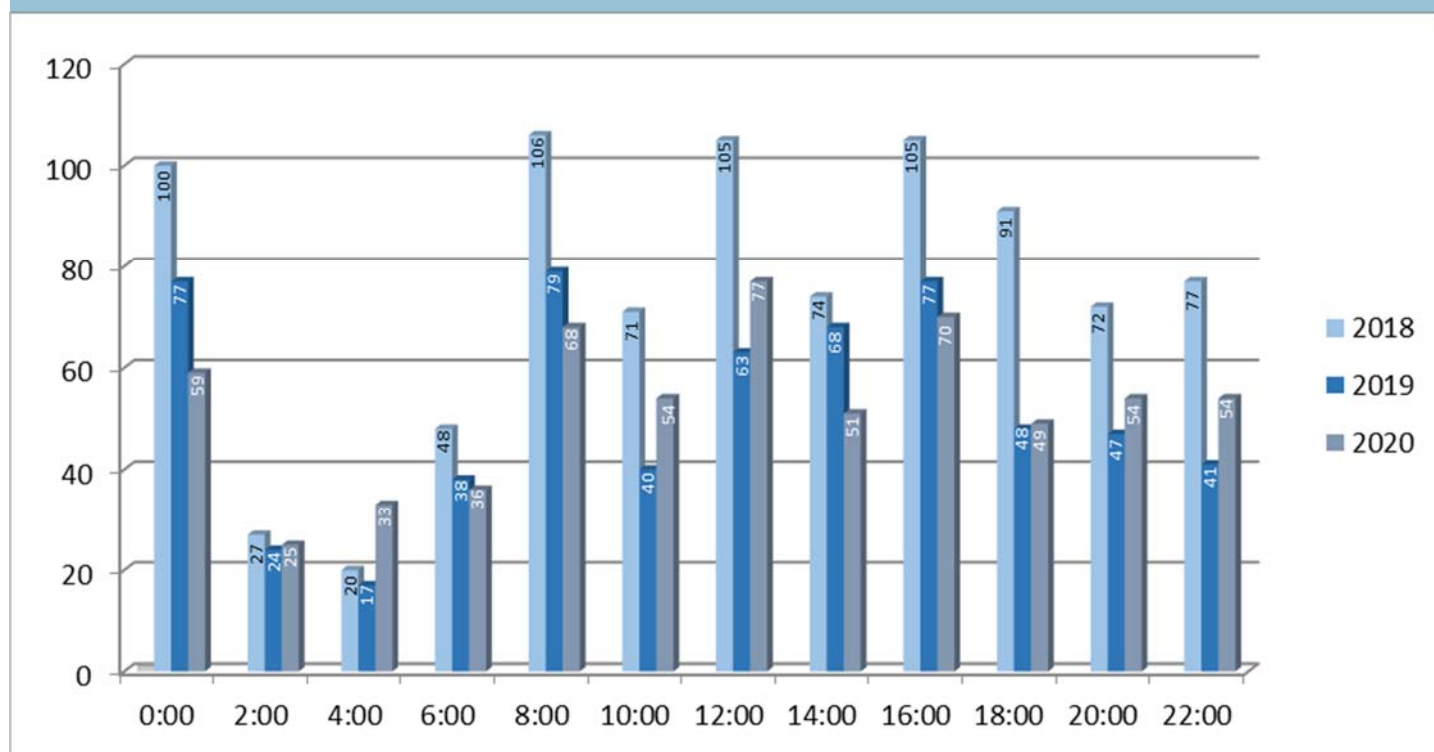

Rape: K.S.A. 21-5503

K.S.A. 21-5503, (a) Rape is:

- (1) Knowingly engaging in sexual intercourse with a victim who does not consent to the sexual intercourse under any of the following circumstances:
 - (A) When the victim is overcome by force or fear; or
 - (B) when the victim is unconscious or physically powerless;
- (2) Knowingly engaging in sexual intercourse with a victim when the victim is incapable of giving consent because of mental deficiency or disease, or when the victim is incapable of giving consent because of the effect of any alcoholic liquor, narcotic, drug or other substance, which condition was known by the offender or was reasonably apparent to the offender;
- (3) sexual intercourse with a child who is under 14 years of age;
- (4) sexual intercourse with a victim when the victim's consent was obtained through a knowing misrepresentation made by the offender that the sexual intercourse was a medically or therapeutically necessary procedure; or
- (5) sexual intercourse with a victim when the victim's consent was obtained through a knowing misrepresentation made by the offender that the sexual intercourse was a legally required procedure within the scope of the offender's authority.

The number of rapes reported to Kansas law enforcement decreased by 7.4 percent in 2020 from the number reported in 2019. During 2020, approximately 12.1 percent of all reported rape incidents in Kansas resulted in an arrest, down from 13.0 percent that were cleared by arrest for the same time period in 2019. This is an arrest rate, not a clearance rate. Some cases may have been cleared by exceptional means (ex: death of offender or victim refusing to testify). This accounts for a small portion of rape offenders when one considers that 79.8 percent of the offenders were reported to be known to the victim. The details of the relationships can be found on page 83.

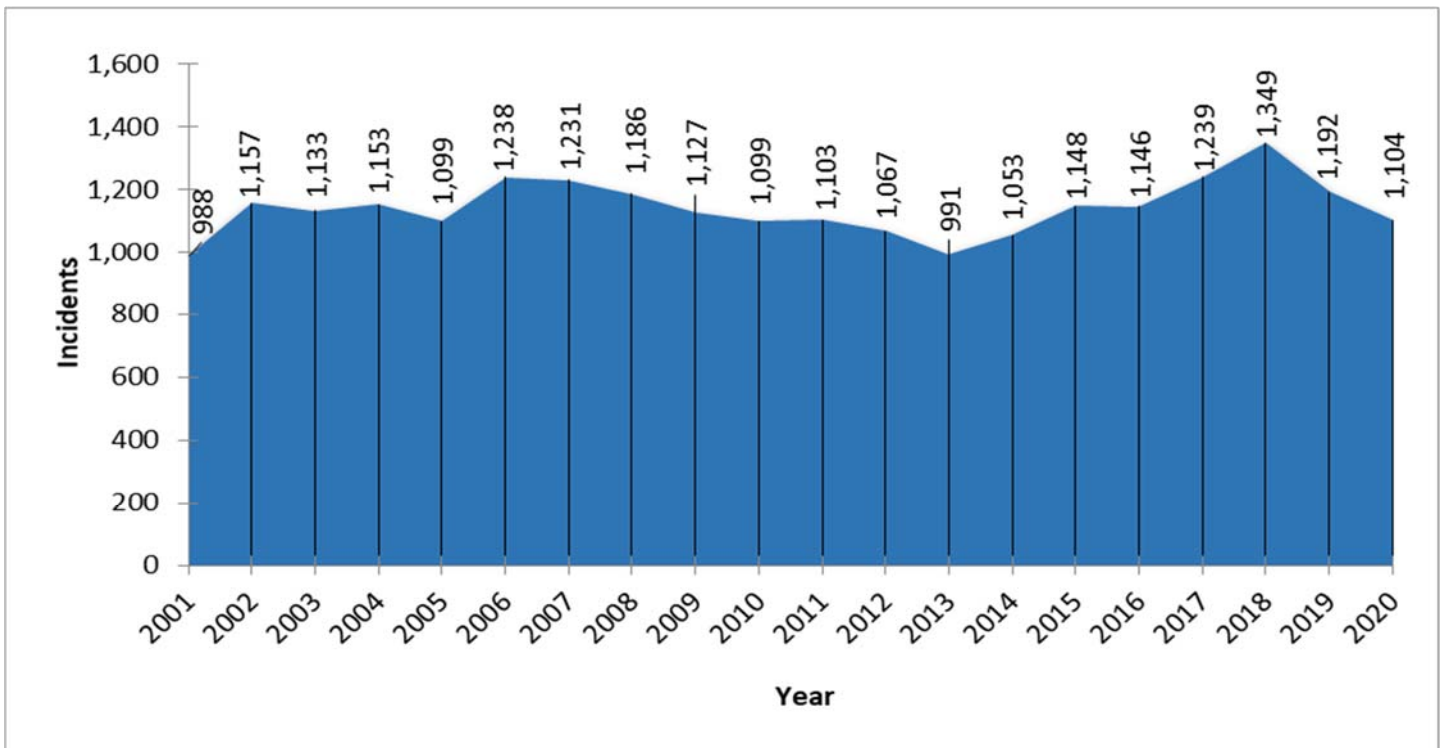
Of the rape incidents reported to law enforcement agencies, the rape victim is usually a female (98.1%) less than 25 years of age (62.0%). The rape offender is most often a male (90.4%) between the ages of 15 and 29 (41.4%). The crime of rape is spread-out relatively even throughout the week with Saturdays being the highest at 16.8 percent. Incidents are most likely to occur between the hours of midnight and 2:00 a.m.

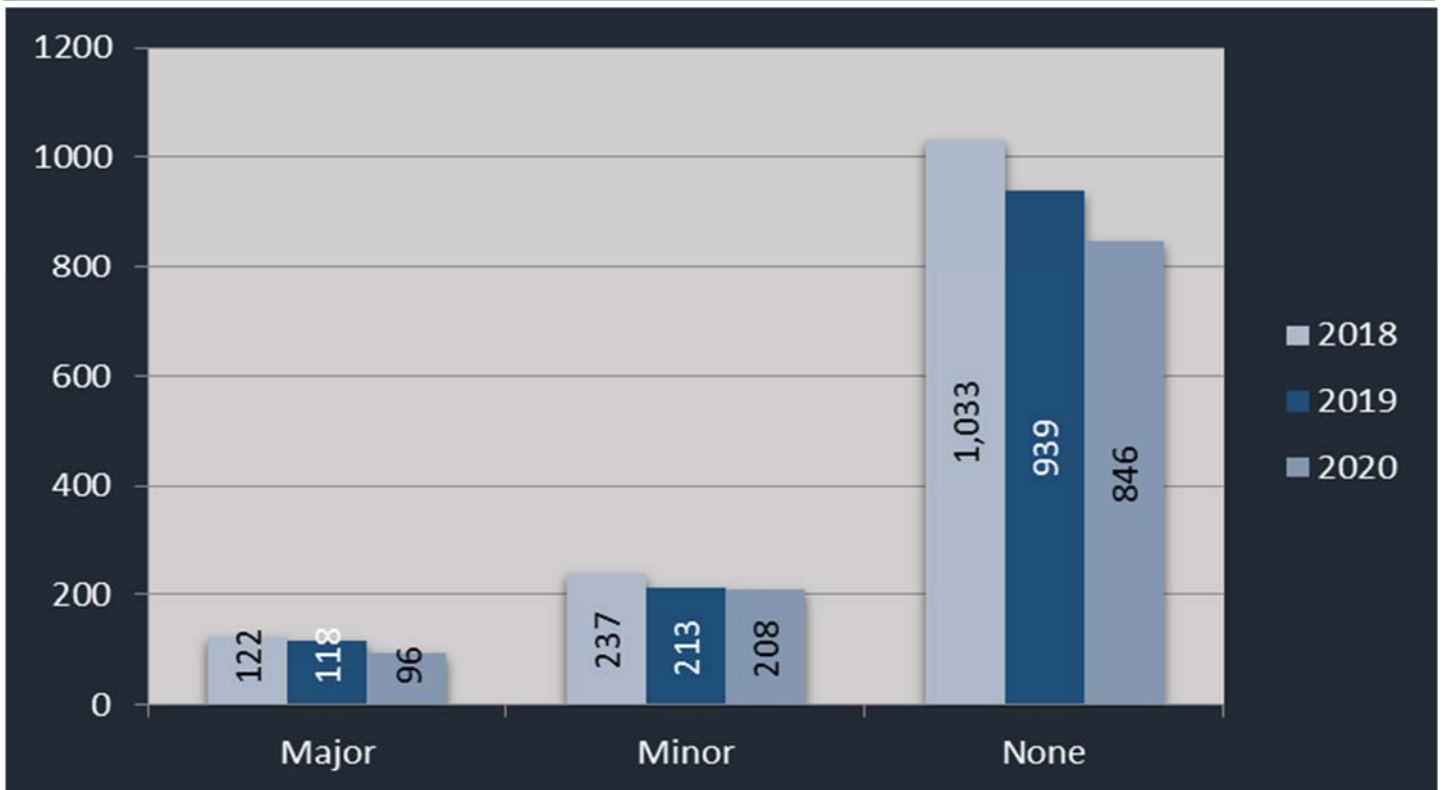

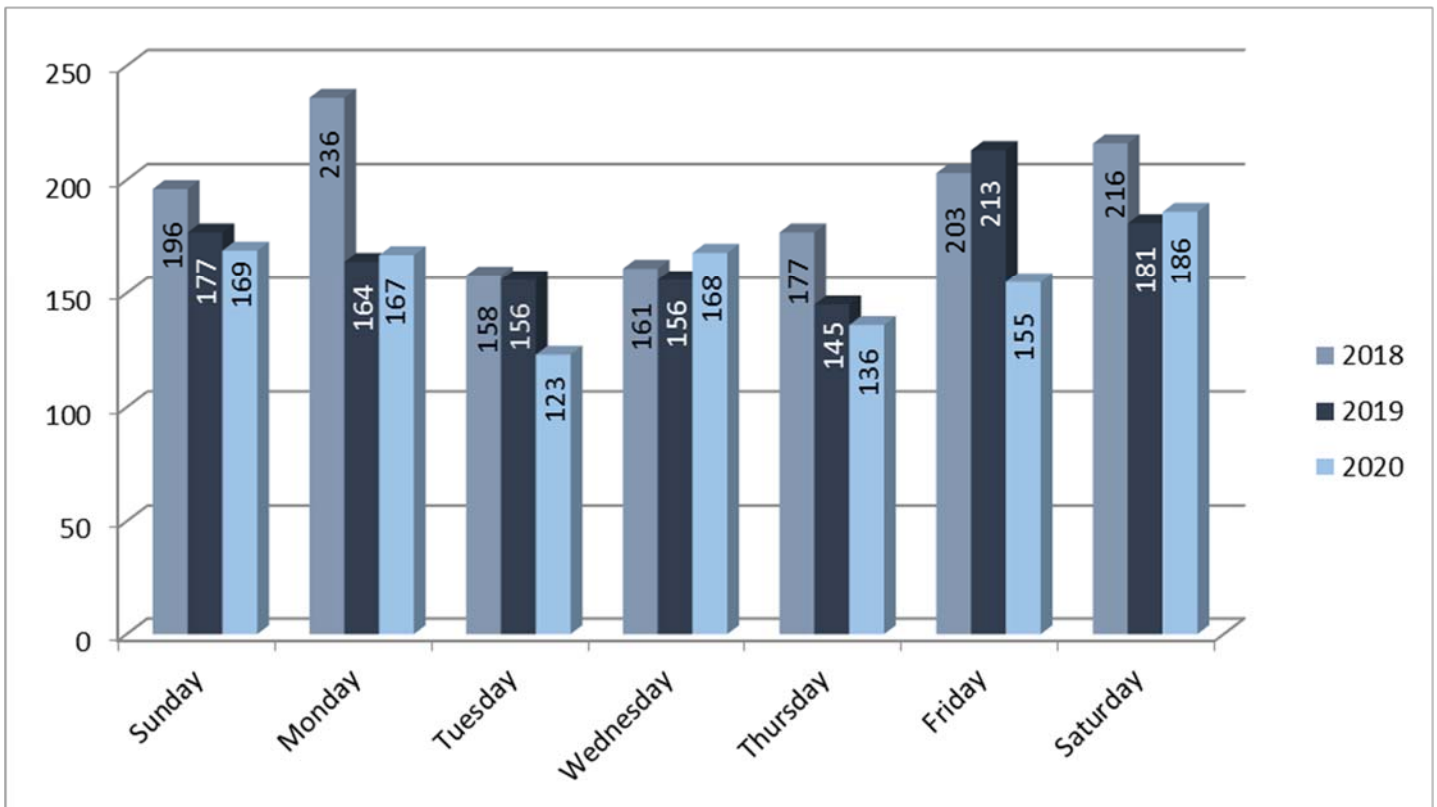

Rape: Day of Occurrence 3yr Trend



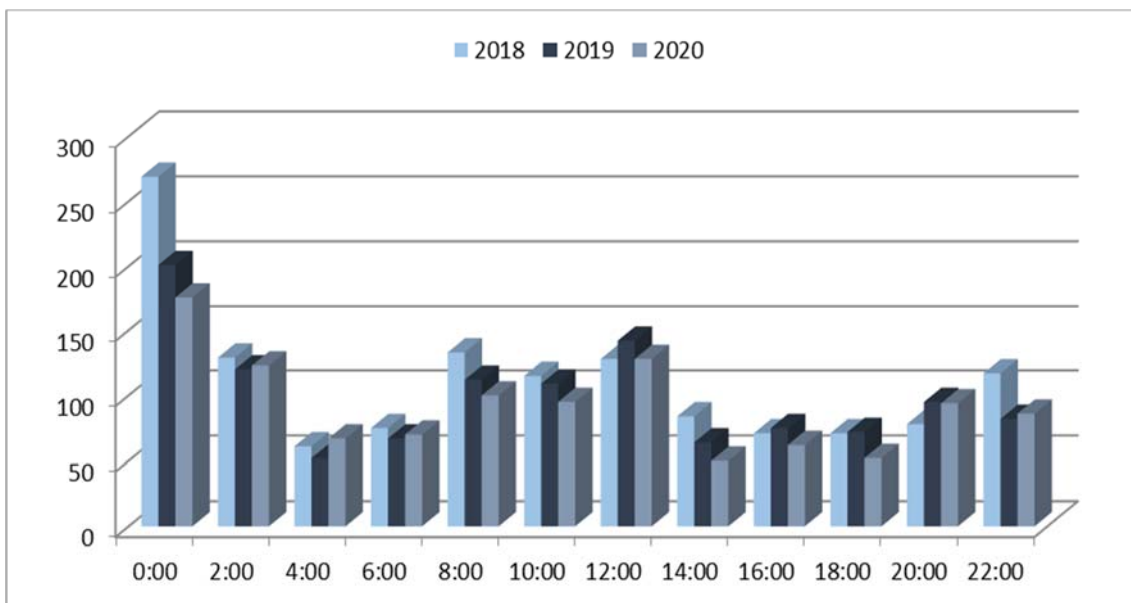

Criminal Sodomy

Criminal Sodomy: K.S.A. 21-5504

The Kansas criminal sodomy statute does not distinguish the gender of a sodomy victim, therefore, offenses involving both male and female victims were reported by law enforcement agencies.

K.S.A. 21-5504, (a) Criminal sodomy is:

- (1) Sodomy between persons who are 16 or more years of age and members of the same sex;
- (2) sodomy between a person and an animal;
- (3) sodomy with a child who is 14 or more years of age but less than 16 years of age; or
- (4) causing a child 14 or more years of age but less than 16 years of age to engage in sodomy with any person or animal.

(b) Aggravated criminal sodomy is:

- (1) Sodomy with a child who is under 14 years of age;
- (2) causing a child under 14 years of age to engage in sodomy with any person or an animal; or
- (3) sodomy with a victim who does not consent to the sodomy or causing a victim, without the victim's consent, to engage in sodomy with any person or an animal under any of the following circumstances:
 - (A) When the victim is overcome by force or fear;
 - (B) when the victim is unconscious or physically powerless; or
 - (C) when the victim is incapable of giving consent because of mental deficiency or disease, or when the victim is incapable of giving consent because of the effect of any alcoholic liquor, narcotic, drug or other substance, which condition was known by, or was reasonably apparent to the offender.

In 2020 the number of criminal sodomy offenses reported to Kansas law enforcement decreased 2.5% from 2019.

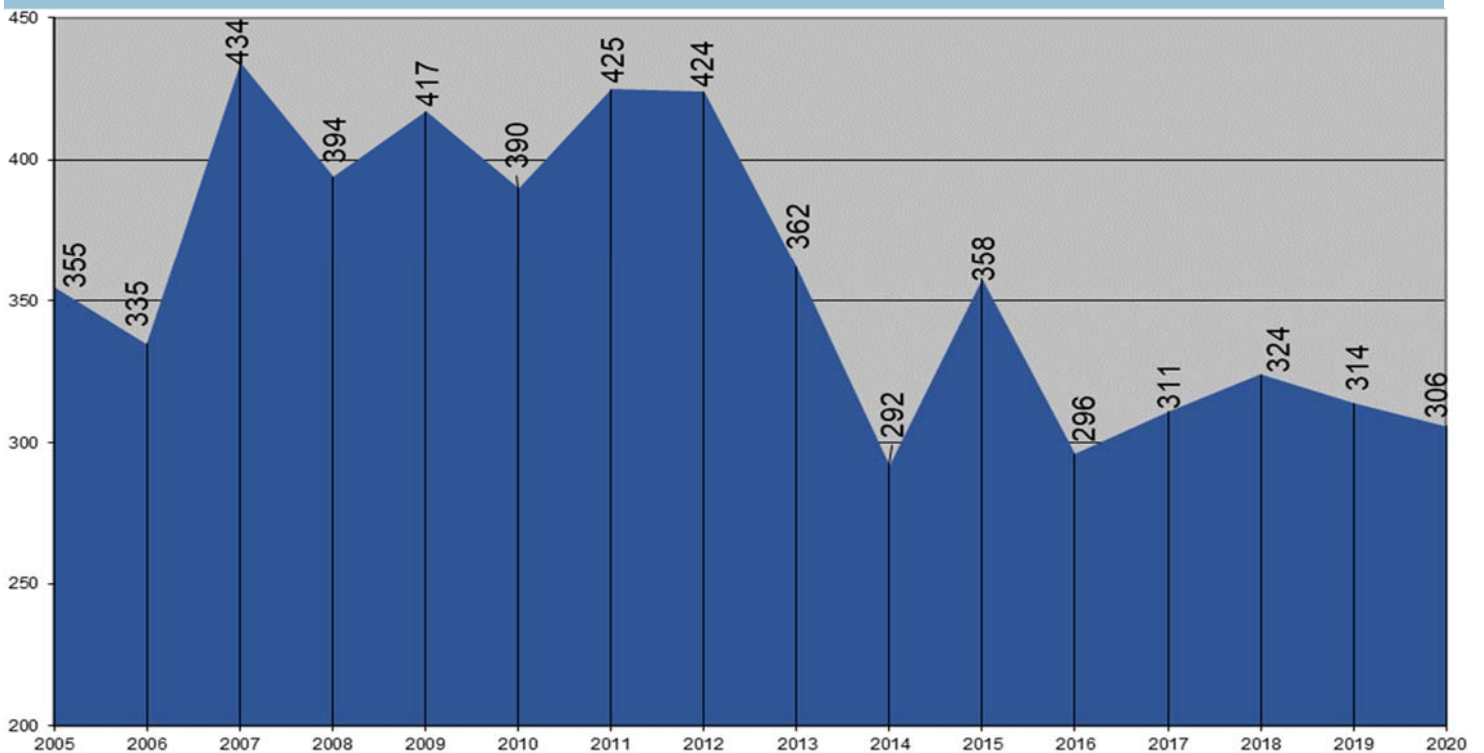
Of the incidents reported to law enforcement agencies, the sodomy victim is usually a female (62.8%) less than 20 years of age (56.8%). The criminal sodomy offender is most often a male (87.1%) between the ages of 10 and 24 (38.2%). The crime of sodomy does not appear to be more predominant on any certain day. Incidents are most likely to occur between the hours of midnight and 2:00 a.m.



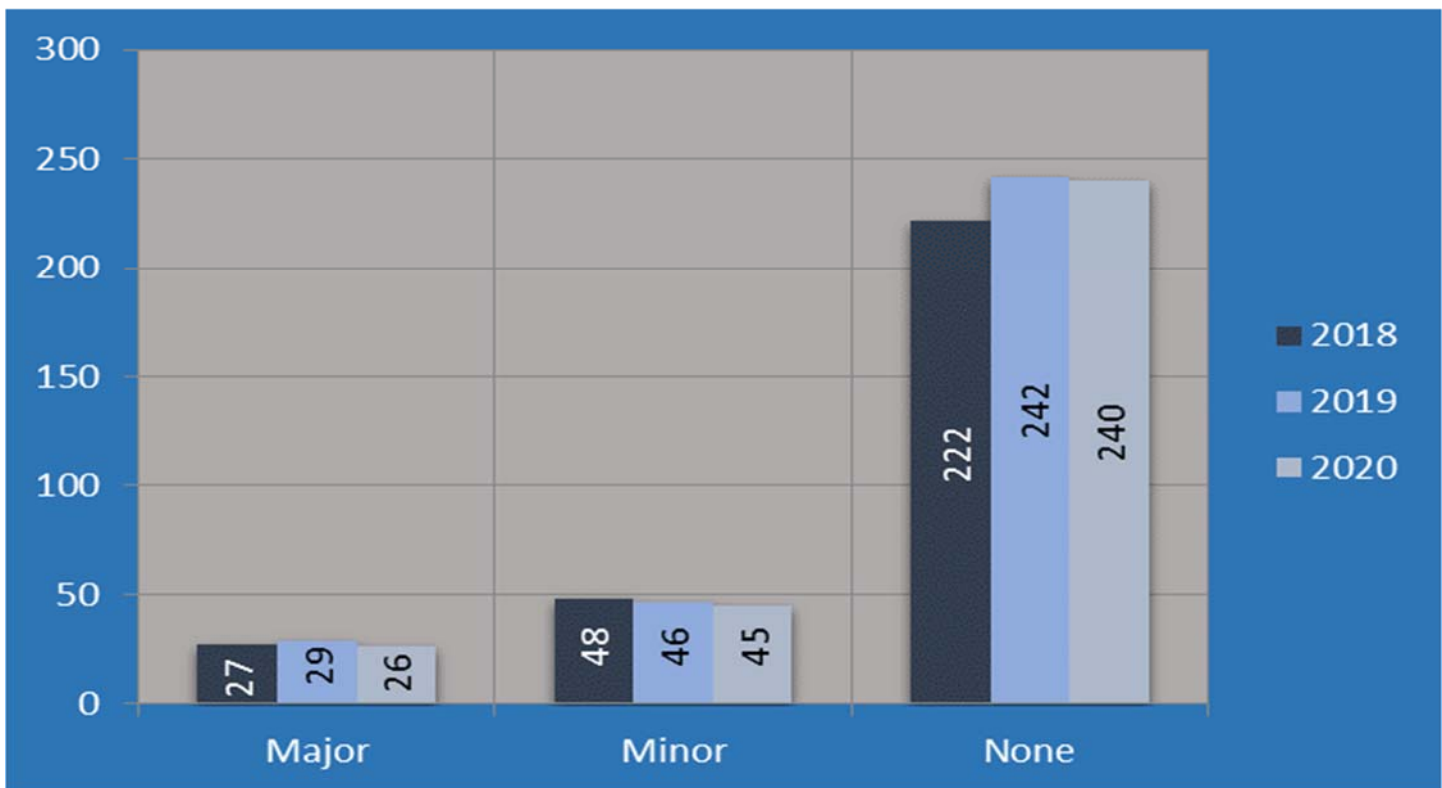

Criminal Sodomy: Type of Physical Injury 3yr Trend ³



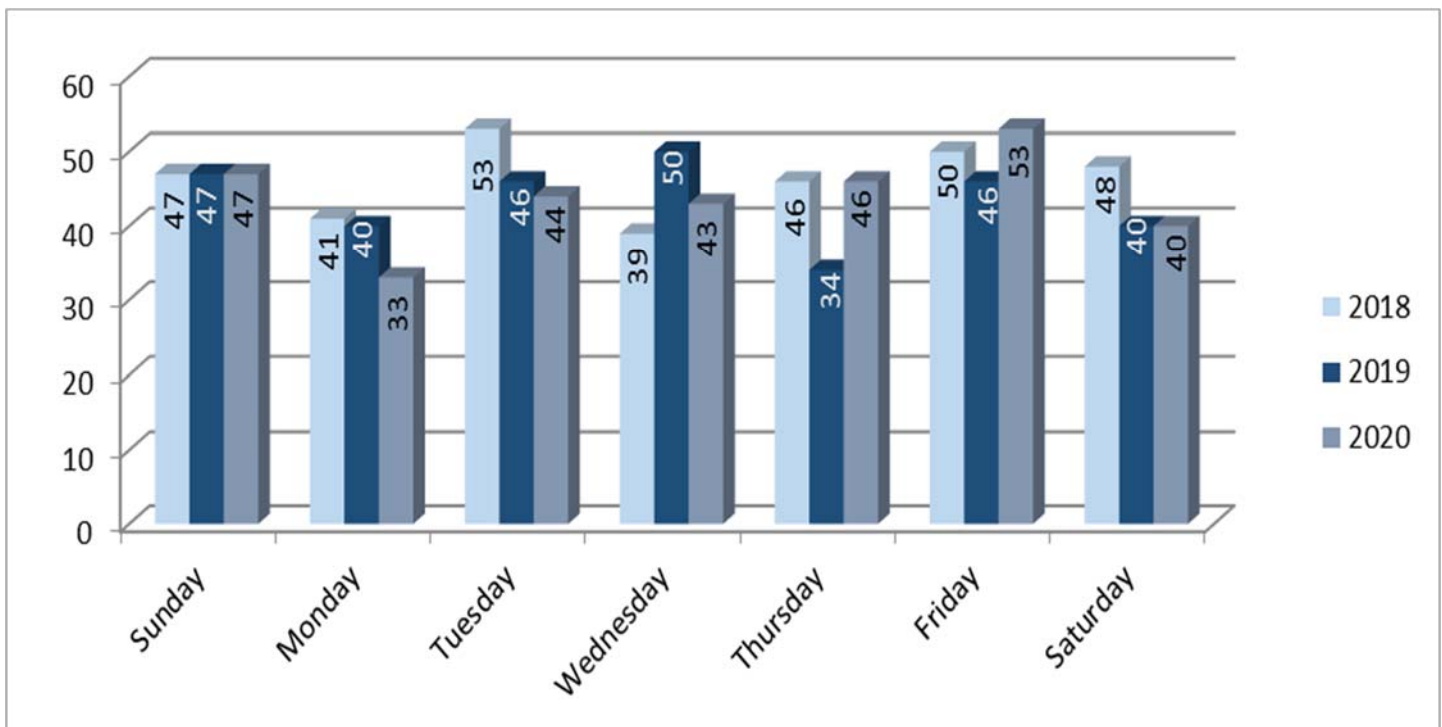

Criminal Sodomy: Day of Occurrence 3yr Trend

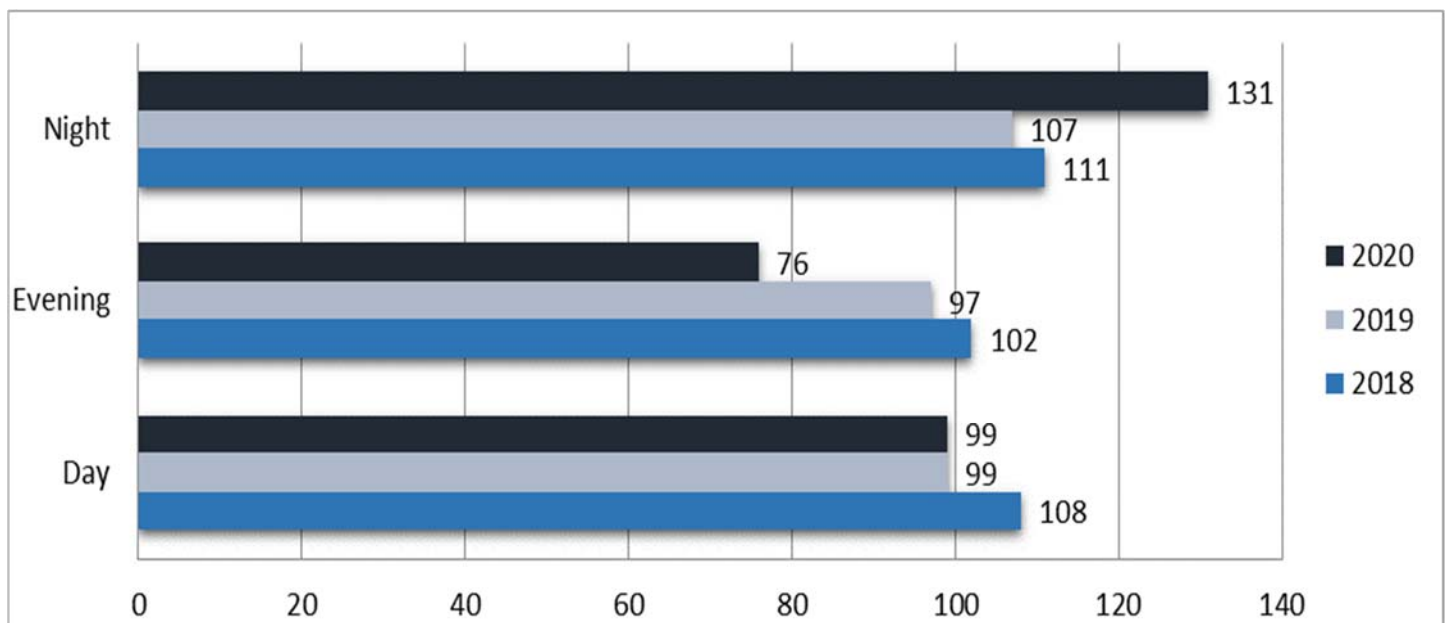

Sexual Battery

Sexual Battery: K.S.A. 21-5505 thru 21-5506

K.S.A. 21-5505, (a) Sexual battery is the touching of a victim who is not the spouse of the offender, who is 16 or more years of age and who does not consent thereto, with the intent to arouse or satisfy the sexual desires of the offender or another.

(b) Aggravated sexual battery is the touching of a victim who is 16 or more years of age and who does not consent thereto with the intent to arouse or satisfy the sexual desires of the offender or another and under any of the following circumstances:

- (1) When the victim is overcome by force or fear;
- (2) when the victim is unconscious or physically powerless; or
- (3) when the victim is incapable of giving consent because of mental deficiency or disease, or when the victim is incapable of giving consent because of the effect of any alcoholic liquor, narcotic, drug or other substance, which condition was known by, or was reasonably apparent to the offender.

Sexual batteries reported to Kansas law enforcement decreased 18.1 percent in 2020 from the number reported in 2019.

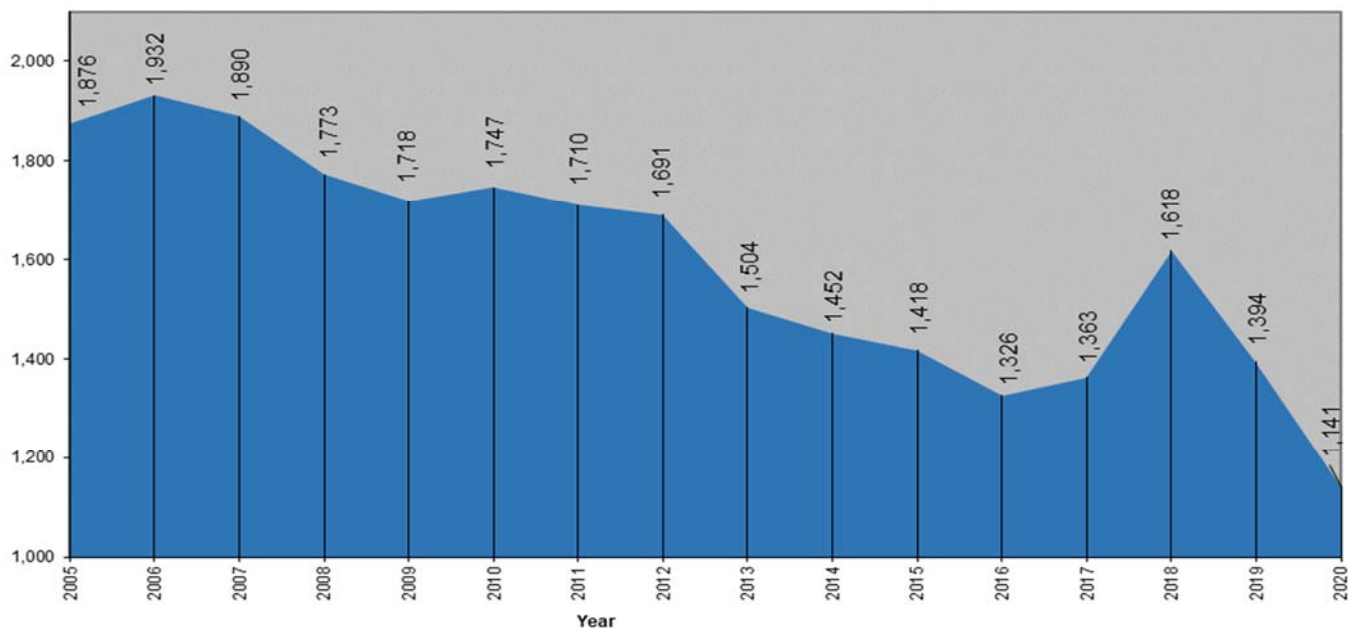
Of the sexual battery incidents reported to law enforcement agencies, the victim is usually a female (83.4%) less than 20 years of age (73.1%). The sexual battery offender is most often a male (87.7%) between the ages of 15 and 19 (30.0%). The crime of sexual battery occurs in almost identical numbers each day of the week. Incidents are most likely to occur between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. and midnight to 2:00 a.m.

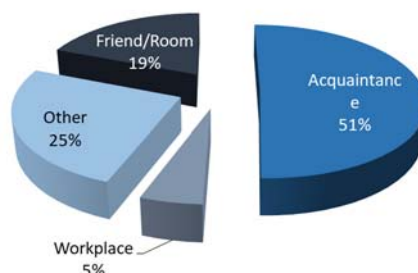

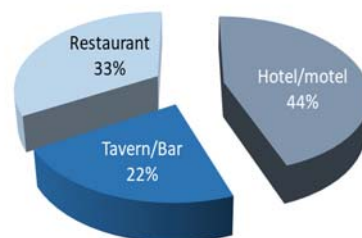

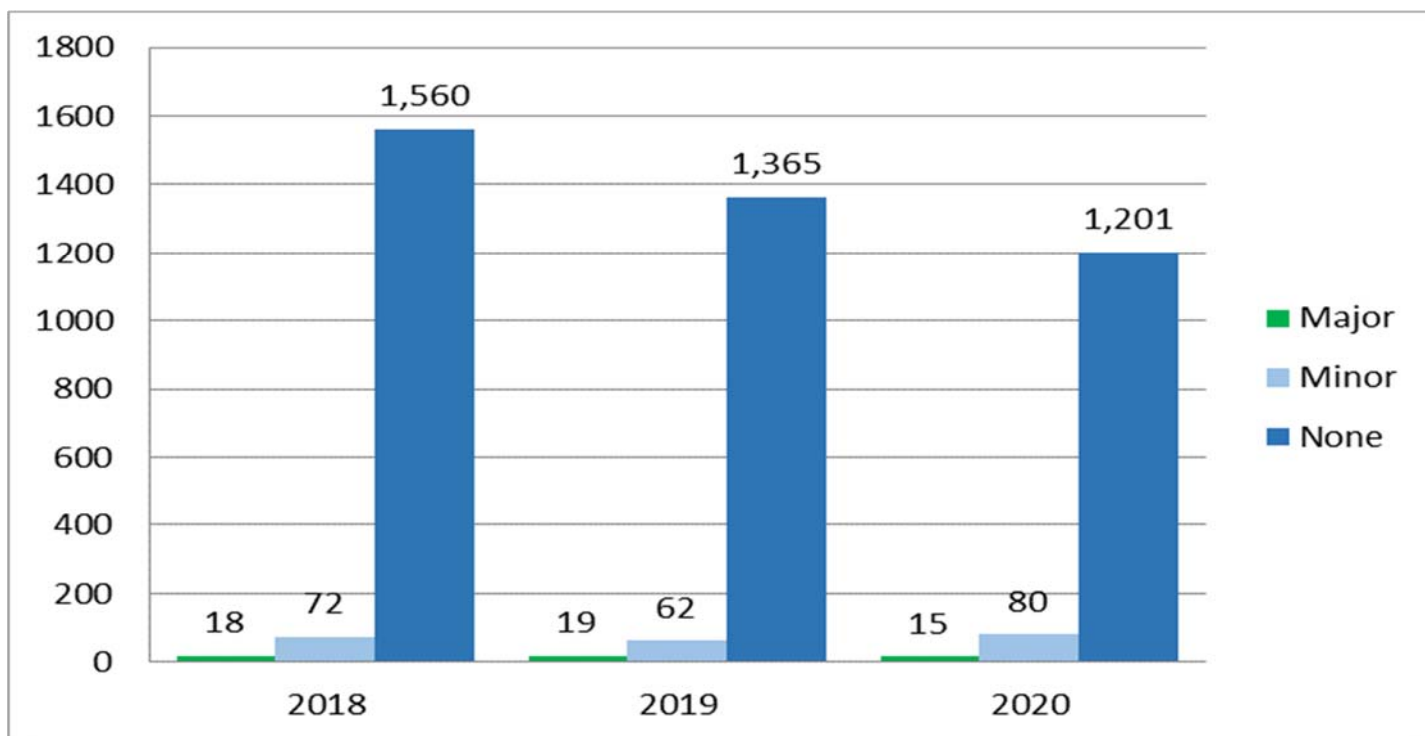

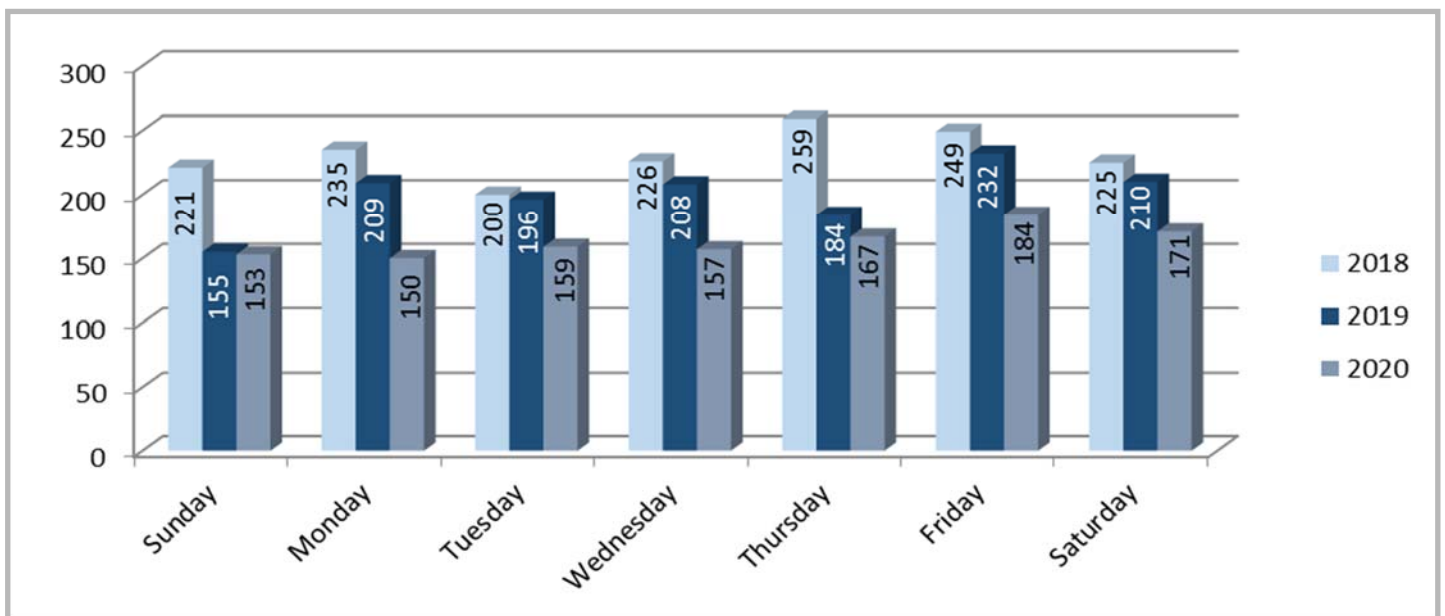

Sexual Battery: Day of Occurrence 3yr Trend

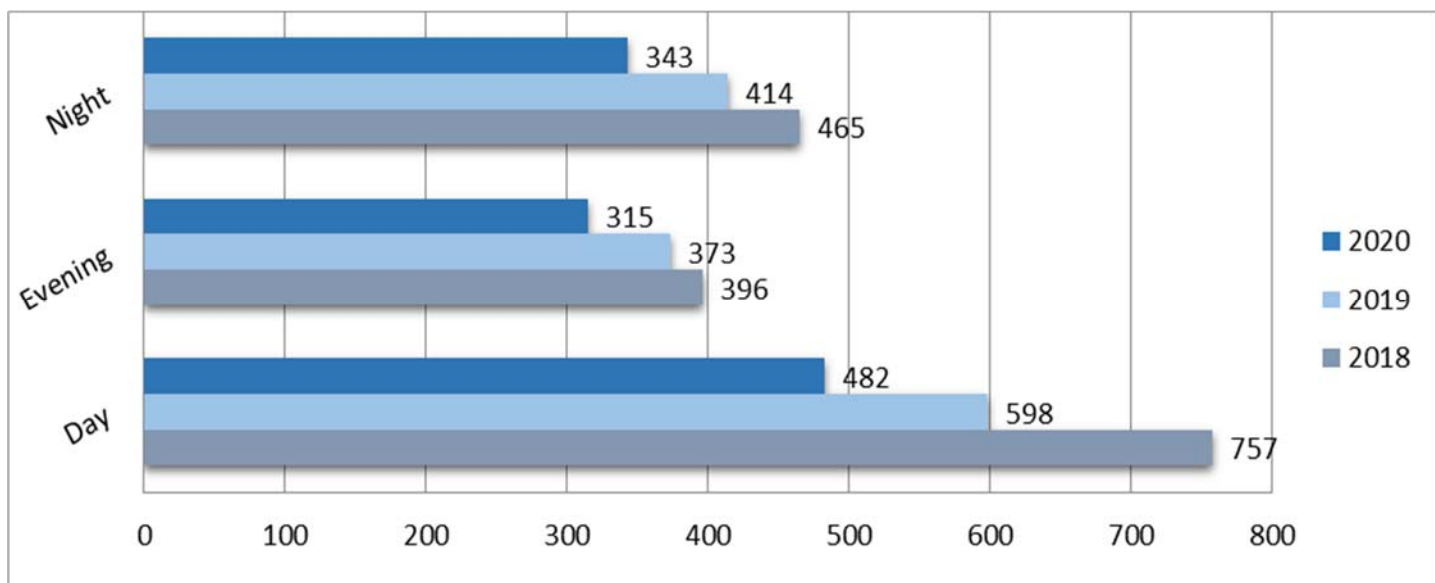
